

Tronox assists local Community Group to regenerate the Tuart Forest.

The Ludlow Tuart Forest Restoration Group (LTFRG) is an community group of volunteers that is committed to restore and protect the iconic Ludlow Tuart Forest area and the historic Ludlow settlement for the benefit of future generations, biodiversity, tourism, education and research.

Integral to the group's venture is planting large numbers of new trees on an annual basis. This year the plan is to plant approximately 17,000 seedlings in the first stage. Tronox was able to assist with supplying the Tuart seed for the propagation of all the seedlings and also carry out and assist with site preparation works.

Greg Overton, the Tronox SouthWest Operations Rehabilitation Manager said "This is a project in line with Tronox values, and aligns with our own commitment to the resotartation of the Ludlow Tuart forest following mining."

Learnings from Tronox's successful restoration of Tuart Forest have been shared with Des Donnelly (Vice President LTFRG) who is co-ordinating the planting program for the group.

The company looks forward to supporting the LTFRG in their endeavours to improve the health of the Ludlow Tuart Forest into the future. "The initial planting of the trees is planned for winter 2019 and will be carried out using a large number of volunteers including hundreds of school children."

The Chamber of Minerals and Energy of Western Australia
